Headlands Primary School Curriculum Overview YEAR 5

Welcome to Term 4

During this term, the children will be working within a creative, theme based curriculum. Our theme this term is 'Raging Rivers'. We hope this, and our future themes, will provide a wide variety of learning to help cover all areas of the curriculum, being available and inspiring to all.

During our first week back at school (Thursday 23rd February), the children will be taking part in a drama experience day to launch our theme for the term. They will pretend to be villagers re-enacting life and therefore we would like the children to come to school dressed in appropriate, comfortable casual clothing (no football kits please).

Year 5 (class 12) will continue to take part in a First Access Tenor Horn project, led by Miss McCrimmon, the school's peripatetic brass teacher. Children will receive an hour's whole class tuition on the tenor horn for ten weeks, culminating in a short informal concert, to which you will be invited. Throughout the ten-week programme, all instruments and lessons are provided free of charge.
