



Woodlands Theme Overview



Communication & Interaction/Personal, Social and Emotional Development

In Rabbit Class, some of our children will use communication boards and PECS with a variety of activities including making requests to dress up the shaving foam snowman, making snowman shaped sandwiches and Incy Wincy Spider crackers. Some Rabbits will play barrier games with a partner using their speaking and listening skills. The overall aim is that when the barrier is removed both have identical results. Our children will also be using their handcrafted rainmakers as we learn the song, 'I hear thunder'.

Scientific Technologies/Understanding the World

Rabbits will use communication boards to develop language as we experiment with shaving foam, water, and food colouring to make DIY rain clouds. We will paint ice and watch the colours run and mix together as the ice cubes melt and even make our own muddy puddles. Rabbits think about the clothes we wear for different weathers. Some Rabbits will reflect on photos from our sunny day on the beach and compare it to our winter weather trips.

We hope this time of year will deliver some snow that the children can learn about and explore.

English and Maths

Rabbits will continue to develop their listening and speaking skills as we immerse ourselves in the story 'Stuck in the Mud'. This will begin with sensory activities that capture the children's focus and bring the book to life. Our other circle time stories will involve sensory experiences and opportunities to use communication boards to label and describe.

Rabbits will use PECS and communication boards to make snowman shape pictures. We will use Peppa and George to create interest in our prepositions work. Some Rabbits focus will be 'in, on and under' and others will work on 'in front, behind and next to'. We will continue to practice counting aloud as we reliably counting amounts to 10. Some Rabbits will learn to understand and use the terms, 'more' & 'less' when describing amounts.
