Year 4, Term 1– Viking Invaders

We are really excited about this term and can't wait to get started on our new school year. It is so lovely to have the children back in their classes! The Year 4 team is made up of Miss Toone in Class 9MT and Mrs Evans in Class 10. The children will also be supported by Miss Edwards and Mr Upex.

Our prime learning challenge this term is 'What were the Vikings well-known for? ' As **Historians**, we will begin by becoming Anglo-Saxon spies to see what is arriving in British waters and will continue by looking at the impact that the Vikings had on the UK and abroad as raiders. In addition, children will explore the Viking culture and Vikings as warriors, traders and settlers. As **Writers** we will be looking at myths and legends inspired by Viking invaders.

In other areas of the curriculum, as **Scientists**, we will investigate 'States of Matter' and explore different materials. Children will also be able to describe properties of materials and how matter can change. As **Artists**, we will observe the flora and fauna of the rainforest and develop our drawing and painting skills. Our focus artist is Georgia O'Keefe and Nixiwaka Yawanawa. We will also be learning how to speak **French** so we can greet each other, give classroom instructions and say everyday items. In **RE**, we will be exploring how promises are explained in the Old Testament through drama and discussion. To enhance our **Computing** skills, we will be digitally editing photographs. In **PE** we will be learning to enhance our social skills through movement and games. In **PHSE** we will be learning about 'being me in my world'.

For ten weeks of this term we will be learning how to play the samba drums with help from the Northamptonshire Music Hub. This will be very exciting!

To support your children, you could discuss whether things are a solid, liquid or gas and the reasons why at home and look at flowers and leaves whilst out on a walk and make observations.
