Year 4, Term Spring 1

Our prime learning challenge this term is **How did Headlands begin? As Historians**, we will be looking at how Northampton began and how it has changed over the years. We will also delve into the history of Headlands Primary and its surrounding areas.

As designers and scientists we will be designing and making lamps with electrical circuits inside. As writers, we will looking at 'Bike Boy'; a story of a boy who travels out into the unknown world. As musicians we will be looking at dances through time paying particular attention to the different notation used.

In other areas of the curriculum, as **mathematicians**, we will be learning about multiplication and division. **As scientists**, children will be learning all about electricity, they will look at what electricity is and how it works. They will also look at different appliances and electrical circuits, children will eventually create their own circuit. In **Religious Education**, children will learn all about the Hindu faith and their beliefs. To develop our **Computing** skills, we will be exploring audio editing. In **Physical Education**, children will be developing their physical fitness and in **French**, children XXXXX. **In PSHE**, children will think about their dreams and goals.


