## Headlands Primary School - Termly curriculum newsletter

Year 4, Term 5 'Who were the Ancient Egyptians?

Our prime learning challenge this term is **Who were the Ancient Egyptians? As Historians**, we will be looking at who the Ancient Egyptians were, the importance of the River Nile and King Tutankhamun. In addition, children will build on their knowledge of timelines. **As writers**, we will looking at the Egyptian Cinderella, an Ancient Egyptian take on the classic fairy-tale Cinderella. **As Read-ers**, children will be exploring fiction that promotes the love of reading and non-fiction texts that support our thematic learning. Each week, we will be reading detectives in order to retrieve and in-fer different information. In **Music** children will learn to sing songs about the Egyptians.

**As Mathematicians**, children will continue to develop their understanding of fractions, they will look at equivalent fractions, simplifying fractions and fractions greater than one. They will began working with decimals; understanding what a decimal is and begin investigating angles in 2D shapes. While continuing to use the written methods to support their workings, the children will focus on the learning of times tables. **As Scientists**, children will investigate classification and how scientists sort and group species of animals. Our **PSHE** theme will be 'Relationships' which will help the children to understand how to build and maintain healthy relationships with themselves, their peers and their community. In other subjects, children will continue to learn **French** and enhance their speaking and listening skills in this language. In **RE**, children will focus on the Pentecost celebration. They will explore how Jesus' disciples received the Holy Spirit after he died and the importance of the resurrection of Jesus. In **Computing**, children will investigate and navigate databases. In **PE**, the children will be competing in athletic activities and developing health and personal fitness.

The knowledge organisers will spark lots of conversations between you and your child.
