Headlands Primary School - Termly curriculum newsletter

Year 3, Term 1 The Stone Age to the Iron Age



Our prime learning challenge this term is: When do you think it was a better time to alive—in the Stone, Bronze or Iron Age? The children will become archaeologists and engage in an archaeological dig to discover some rare stone age artefacts. Their findings will be recorded on an enquiry sheet. As Historians, the children will learn about prehistory and will know that this was a period of great change. They will be able to sequence the three prehistorical eras in chronological order and will know why these eras have been given these names. Children will develop an understanding of power, food and farming, settlement and trade through the changes that occur over the three eras. As Artists, we will draw stone age artefacts. Children will follow and copy modelled abstract shapes of increasing complexity and repeat to make patterns and textures. They will learn to use pencil, charcoal, felt tip pen and oil pastels effectively to give tone and form to a drawing through pattern and blended shading. They will also study the work of Picasso and begin to appreciate some of his work.

As Writers, we will be developing our skills by writing to entertain and writing to inform. Children will endeavour to use the sentence stacking approach as they write both an adventure story and a set of instructions. Linking our writing to Computing, children will learn and use digital writing skills to present their instructions. As Readers, children will be exploring both fiction and non-fiction texts each week, become reading detectives in order to retrieve and infer different information. As Mathematicians, children will be developing their understanding of numbers and place value. We will carry out lots of investigations and explore different ways of representing our findings, while continuing to enhance basic skills and the learning of times tables.

As Scientists, the children will look at what happens when an object is placed in front of a light source, thus creating shadows. They will investigate, observe and find patterns in the way that the size of shadows changes by moving a light source. Children will gain the knowledge that in order to see objects we need light and that without it, we get dark. During the topic, children will learn and recognise that the light from the sun can be dangerous and that we can protect our eyes from the sun. Amongst their investigations of discovering how light interacts with objects, they will also learn about reflective surfaces and how these can be useful for seeing better in the dark. In other subjects, children will begin to learn French. They will also explore Christianity in RE, enhancing their understanding of the Creation story and how this has impacted the way Christians live their lives. In PE, the children will learn a progress of movements and skills alongside providing opportunity to enhance their social skills. 
