## **Headlands Primary School - Termly curriculum newsletter**

Year 3, Term 2 Do you think the HS2 will benefit the United Kingdom?



Our prime learning challenge this term is: **Do you think HS2 will benefit the United Kingdom?** The children will learn about the HS2 project and how it will impact on the environment and local communities, exploring both sides of the argument relating to the project. There will be a visit to a train station to experience first hand what railway life is like. **As Geographers** the children will explore the relationship between continents, countries and counties, and will be able to name and locate some of the counties that the HS2 will run through. This theme will be an exciting stimulus for the children in **Design Technology**, as they will design and build their own bridge which needs to be strong enough to provide wildlife with safe passage across the HS2 train tracks! **As Designers**, the children will investigate different types of bridges, exploring the structure and strength., then design, construct and evaluate their constructions. This theme will inspire the children as **Writers**, as they will compose a persuasive letter to the Prime Minister, encouraging him to either prevent or go ahead with the project, depending on the outcomes of the debate!

As Writers, the children will take the journey through different plot points in the story 'Owl Moon', then create their own story of mystery and suspense. As Readers, children will be exploring fiction, nonfiction and poetry texts each week, become reading detectives in order to retrieve and infer different information. As Mathematicians, children will continue to develop their understanding of addition and subtraction and will begin to use the column method. They will continue to explore different ways of representing working out, while continuing to enhance basic skills and their learning of times tables. As Scientists, the children will learn about the diets of different animals, including humans. They will name the main bones in the human body and the three main purposes of the skeleton. They will identify vertebrates, invertebrates and exoskeletons and explain the differences between them, while discovering how muscles help us to move. In other subjects, children will continue to learn French and enhance their speaking and listening skills in this language. In RE, we will explore festivals such as Christmas and Diwali, focussing on the celebrations as a festival of light and love. In PSHE the children will be celebrating the differences in themselves, their families and others as well as discussing how to solve conflicts in their lives. In Computing, the children will develop their coding skills, using Scratch software. In Music the children will be taught to play simple rhythms on the ukulele.
