# **Headlands Primary School- Termly curriculum newsletter**

Year 1, Term 2—What is it like where I live?



Our prime learning challenge this term is 'What is it like where I live?'

As **Geographers**, the children will learn about where live and begin to understand that Northampton is in England which is in the United Kingdom. They will also be exploring what it is like where they live by going on a walk of their local area. They will identify buildings, types of houses, transport and other services along the route. To finish and celebrate their learning, they will use the information that they have gathered to create and build a 3D map of the local area.

#### In other subjects:

As **Writers**, the children will explore Autumn by going on a leaf hunt in the school grounds and learn about deciduous and evergreen trees. This is a sparkling start for our poetry unit as the children will learn about adjectives and similes to write their own Autumn poems. They will also learn about the first person (using I) and the past tense to write a recount. The children will continue to develop their simple sentence writing skills throughout. As **Mathematicians**, the children will consolidate their understanding of numbers 1 to 20. They will learn to use part-part-whole models to find number bonds (pairs of numbers that make an amount). They will be able to identify odd and even numbers. They will use pictures to help them solve simple additions (adding together two 1 digit numbers). As **Scientists**, the children will learn about the four different seasons and the changes in weather in each season. They will also explore which part of the body is associated with each sense

As **Historians**, the children will find out why we celebrate Bonfire night by learning about the Gun Powder plot. In **PE**, children will learn different dynamic and static balances. In **RE**, the children will learn about the Christmas story and why Christians give gifts at Christmas. This will then link to our Nativity performance of the Christmas story. Our focus in **PSHE** will be talking about our emotions using the 'Zones of Regulation' and 'celebrating differences'. As **Musicians**, Year 1 will explore sound using their voice, actions and instruments. They will also learn seasonal songs. These will support conversations that you may have at home about what we will be teaching and the vocabulary that we will be using.

We look forward to a really exciting term.
