Outcome trackers


Your child's teacher has created a sent home the latest outcome tracker. This highlights the areas on their EHCP which will be focussed on in the coming weeks. As this term is a short term, more targets have been set and the outcome tracker will continue for the term after the Easter break.

Snack and Life Skills Money

We continue to ask for a donation towards the cost of snack, life skills lessons and out and about activities. This can be paid termly - £5 for this term, weekly (£1) or as a one-off payment of £18 for the remainder of the year. The money is spent on providing daily snacks and cooking ingredients as well as funding some of our out and about activities including visits to cafes and charity shops.



World Book Day



This takes place on Thursday 7th March. The children may dress up on this day as a superhero (it could be a fictional superhero or a real-life superhero). There is no expectation to create elaborate costumes or buy costumes. If you do not wish for your child to dress as a superhero they may wear their own clothes for the day.

This term we will be celebrating our amazing children through taking part in the national Neurodiversity Celebration Week. This will involve PSHE lessons,

assemblies, and activities for the whole school. On Wednesday 20th March, Kayley Battison will be in Woodlands to meet with parents over a coffee and cake to discuss neurodiversity within her family and day to day life. We will also be welcoming Mark Atkinson, a former Woodlands pupil, who will be talking to some of our older children about his experiences in school, home, and the workplace.

On Friday 22nd March we will celebrate the end of the week by having a dress up day. We would like all children to dress as something of importance to them.
